# WORLD NO TOBACCO DAY-2022

Theme: Protection of Environment from Tobacco

# World No Tobacco Day (WNTD)

is observed around the world every year on 31st May. This yearly celebration informs the public about the harmful consequences of tobacco use; the nefatious business practices of tobacco companies along with responsibilities of citizens to protect future generations from the menace of tobacco use. The theme of WNID-2022 is "Tobacco: Threat to our Environment". The entire life cycle of tobacco is a prodigiously polluting and damaging entire supply chain of environment. Tobacco products contain all the carcinogens, heavy metals, pesticides, and nicotine which enters the food chains of various living creatures viz. humans, aquatic animals, birds and hence causes irreversible harm to them. Across the globe around 3.5 million hectares of land are destroyed to grow tobacco each year which also contributes to deforestation of 200 000 hectares of land. The litter of 4.5 trillion cigarette butts are disposed every year generating 1.69 billion pounds of toxic waste and releasing thousands of chemicals into the air, water and soil. In India, 15,000 tonnes of plastic waste is generated daily from smokeless tobacco products of which only 9,000 tonnes is collected and processed.

#### Ban on manufacturing, sale, storage and transportation of Pan Masala extended for one year: Jharkhand



Food Safety Commissioner of Jharkhand has extended the ban on manufacturing, sale, storage and transportation of Pan Masala in the state for further one year w.e.f. 03-06 2022.

The gram panchayath in Udupi district, Karnataka was declared as a Tobacco free village, after inspired community efforts by DHO office and team KMC, Manipal.

#### FSSAI to bring pan masala under the ambit of FSS Act completely

The FSSAI has decided to bring pan masala under the ambit of FSS Act. Under this amendment, pan masala will be added as a food category for which the food businesses need to get FSSAI licence or registration for manufacturing. Also, the amendment proposed that 'No synthetic food colour permitted in pan masala and areca nut based mouth fresheners'.



# Pandemic resulted in increased quit rates: India

The Impact of Covid-19 on caller characteristics and Quit Rates has increased based on the experience of Regional Tobacco Quitline. However, the awareness about the quitline services as well as other tobacco cessation services needs to be expanded to reach more tobacco users.





Air India completely prohibits smoking and consumption of any intoxicating substances at the workplace with a zero-tolerance for violations.

### Crackdown on illegal sale of tobacco in Mohali: 100 challaned

The teams, comprising of nodal officers and other health officials, carried out surprise checks at 220 shops, kiosks and on street vendors selling tobacco products. "A total of 100 challans were issued to shopkeepers and street vendors selling tobacco products in violation of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products (Prohibition) (COTPA) Act, 2003, and a fine of Rs 18,000 was collected from the violators.
