It is perusal of the reference cited above the District Level Coordination Committee meeting conducted by the Chaiman of DLCC, Honourable District Collector, Mancherial on Dt. 08.09.2022 at Collectors Conference Hall, Mancherial.

The following points were discussed and implement the agenda, instructed by the Chairperson of the Committee.

- Role and responsibilities of each line department officers were discussed in detailed.
- To put the note file for formation of "Enforcement Squad" immediately.
- Instructed to identify a Nodal officer of every department for implementation of COTPA Act
- To instruct all line department officers to implement the COTPA act effectively
- Display the "No Smoking Zone" and caution boards at every Department
- Instructed that all the official are look after their office premises as tobacco free from smoking and splitting.
- Advised that Municipal Commissioners to monitor all the shops and remove the smoking points at Tea Stalls , Bakeries, Hotels and Shops.
- District Education officer was advised to make all the schools and its premises as Tobacco free schools as per guidelines of National Tobacco Control Programme
- Instruction given to Commercial Tax Department to verify the bills and impose fine if COTPA Act over ruled.
- Instructed Agricultural Department to do awareness on adverse effects of tobacco growing to tobacco growers and advise provide information on alternative crops.
- Ride on Pan Shops, Provisional Stored and other Shops to stop Tobacco Product Selling.
- Instructed all the committee members to strict implementation of COTPA act as per their roles and responsibilities.

- Instructed to maintenance of reports and records on monthly basis.
- Instructed to collect the data of Oral Cancer (due to tobacco use) from all the Government and Private health institutions.
- Instructed to DM&HO as a Convenor 1. To conduct the monthly meeting with DLCC regularly. 2.To monitor monthly reports regularly 3. To Supervise the all activities of District Tobacco Control Cell on monthly basis.

#### **Indian Tobacco Control Law- At a Glance**

Following are the key provisions of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products (Prohibition of Advertisements and Regulation of Trade and Commerce, Production, Supply and Distribution) Act, 2003 (COTPA) "COTPA"

- Ban on smoking in public places (Section 4)
- Ban on direct and indirect advertisement (Section 5)
- Ban on sales to and by minors below 18 (6a) and within a radius of 100 yards of any educational institution (6b) ( Section 6)
- Pictorial health warnings (Section 7)

COTPA was enacted on May 18, 2003 while it came into force a year after (May 1, 2004).

### **Roles and Responsibilities:**

- The above Committee members shall be authorized to conduct the enforcement drives and charge the challans against violation of Section 4, Section 5, Section 6a and 6b of COTPA act 2003
- The enforcement raids should be a regular activity to the squad. However minimum 10 raids conducted in a month.
- Documenting the details of the raids in the check list form (Shall be provided by O/O Commissionerate)
- Deposit the challans into the respective head of account mentioned in the challan Book.
- Monthly reporting on the no.of. raids conducted /no. of. challans raised and amount of fine is collected to the nodal department

- (Health & Family Welfare)
- Presenting the status report of enforcement raids in monthly DLCC Meeting.

#### **Enforcement Squad Formation:**

- Enforcement squad is a set of authorized officials identified by the District Tobacco Control Cell (DTCC) and constituted preferably under the guidance of the Collector/ District Magistrate (DM).
- The overall responsibility of this squad is to enforce and monitor all the provisions under COTPA and also ensure regular reporting of the violations during the monthly crime review meetings.
- The Department of Health should take the lead in collaboration with the Department of Home Affairs in the formation of these enforcement squads and conducting regular Raids

#### **Roles and Responsibilities:**

- Carry out regular enforcement drives in public places like public transports, restaurants, Government buildings, health facilities, educational institutions.
- The fine collected from the penalties to be deposited in a separate head of account.
- Funds generated from collected fines to be utilized in tobacco control initiatives or awareness campaigns in the state/district.

# <u>Persons who are authorized to impose and collect the fine against the violations</u> (Section 4&6):

- 1. Vice Chancellor or Director or Proctor or Principal or Headmaster or In-Charge of an Educational Institution
- 2. Assistant Labour Commissioner from the Department of Labour

- 3. All officers of the rank of Sub-Inspector in State Food and Drug Administration from the Department of Food and Drugs
- 4. All officers of the rank of Inspectors from the Department of Education
- 5. All police officers of the rank of Sub-Inspector of Police and above
- 6. Municipal Health Officers

- 7. Representatives of Panchayati Raj Institutions (Chairperson or Sarpanch or Panchayat Secretary)
- 8. District Programme Manager or Finance ManagerDistrict Health Society (National Rural Health Mission)
- 9. Civil Surgeon or Chief Medical Officer at District Hospital or Medical Officer at Primary Health Centre (PHC)
- 10. Block Development Officer, Block Extension Educator(BEE)
- 11. Director or Joint Director of Department of Health, and Department of Education in the State Government
- 12. Nodal Officers of State and District Tobacco Control Cell under National Tobacco Control Programme

#### **School Programmes:**

The Cigarettes and other Tobacco products (Prohibition of Advertisement and Regulations of Trade and Commerce Production, Supply and Distribution) Act (COTPA) in 2003, is enacted to protect children and youth from adverse and harmful effects of tobacco use. Specific provisions of COTPA include:

- 1) Section 6(a): Prohibition of sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products to a person below the age of 18 years.
- 2) Section 6(b): Prohibition of sale of tobacco products within a radius of 100 yards of educational institutions.

A Yellow line or pink Line campaign is initiated at educational institutions, with the objective to inform/alert Officers/Staffs/Teachers of Educational Institutions about harmful effects of tobacco use and to declare educational institutions

tobacco free by ensuring there is no sale of tobacco products within a radius of 100 yards of educational institutions in compliance with Section 6(b) of COTPA.

All Education Institutions of the State of Telangana shall:

- a. display a Board/Wall paint measuring 60cm x 45cm at a conspicuous place(s) outside the premises, stating "sale of cigarettes and other tobacco products in an area within a radius of one hundred yards of the educational institution is strictly prohibited and is a punishable offence" (Annexure-1)
- b. display boards stating "No Smoking Area- Smoking here is a punishable offence", as per the specification in (Annexure-2), at the entrance of the educational institution, in case there are more than one entrance at each such entrance and conspicuous place(s) inside. In case if there are more than one floor, at each floor including the staircase and entrance to the lift/s at each floor. with the name of the person for reporting violations.
- c. ensure there is no smoking or chewing of tobacco inside the premises of educational institution by students/teachers/other staff members/visitors. Head of the institution or his nominee should regularly check for evidences of tobacco use i.e. cigarette/beedi butts or discarded gutka/tobacco pouches, spitting spots in the premises.
- d. shall paint/mark/draw a Pink Line/ Yellow line at the distance of 100 yards i.e,, 91 meters from the outer limits of the boundary wall/fence of the educational institution with the message "Tobacco Free Zone" at the entrance of the educational institution, in case there are more than one entrance at each such entrance and conspicuous place(s) outside.

## **ANNEXURE 2 (Prototype Sign Board)**

- 1. The board shall be of a minimum size of 60 cm by 30 cm of white background
- It shall contain a circle of no less than 15 cm outer diameter with a red perimeter of no less than
   cm wide with a picture, in the center, of a cigarette or beedi with black smoke and crossed by a red band.
- 3. The width of the red band across the cigarette shall equal the width of the red perimeter.
- 4. The board shall contain the warning "No Smoking Area Smoking Here is a punishable offence", in English or one Indian language, as applicable.
- 5. The board shall the name of the person(s) to whom a complaint may be made.
